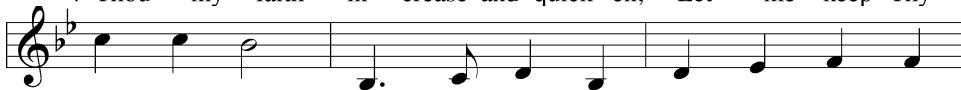


Preface

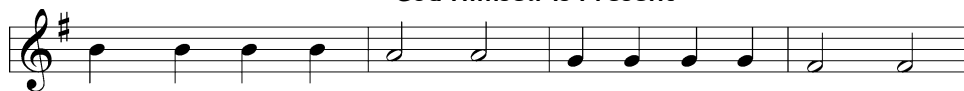

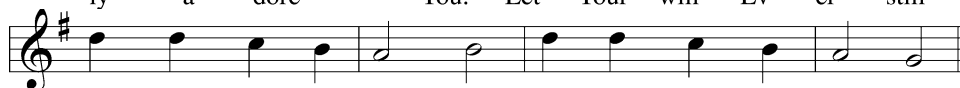
