## As We Gather

We must come to grips with God as He is, not as we wish Him to be. In John 1:14, we hear that Jesus is the fullness of both grace <u>and</u> truth. We often have a tough time holding these two concepts together in our own lives. How can I be both gracious ('utterly forgiving') and truthful ('unashamedly honest') in my interactions? In Jesus, we come face to face with the unquenchable mercy of God and yet the unabashed truth of God. As C.S. Lewis once reflected upon in his book series, "The Chronicles of Narnia"—our God is not a tame God. He is not a product of wishful thinking, nor is He a God easily shaped by our desires. He will always resist our attempts to fit Him neatly into our categories and conceptions. He calls us to maintain the tension within the truth of His Word and the grace of His word.

# Second Reading "Saved by Grace ... and ... Created for Works" Ephesians 2:1-10

<sup>1</sup>And you were dead in the trespasses and sins <sup>2</sup>in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— <sup>3</sup>among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. <sup>4</sup>But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, <sup>5</sup>even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— <sup>6</sup>and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, <sup>7</sup>so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup>For by grace you have been saved through faith. # Introduction to the Lord's Prayer (Please stand)

The Small Catechism

- L: Jesus taught us to begin our prayers by calling upon "Our Father in heaven." This is not only a confession of who our God is, but also our relationship with Him. What does it mean that the Creator of everything has revealed Himself to us in this unique way?
- C: With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father.

## **Confession of Sins & Proclamation of Forgiveness**

- P: We come before our loving Father acknowledging that we have not lived by His gracious will for our lives. Let us therefore confess our need for His grace and His truth to be at work within our lives.

Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Holy Spirit.
