

As We Gather

Every week when we gather together in church, at some point, a pastor stands up and speaks. He preaches. He delivers a sermon. In popular culture, the words "sermon" and "preach" have negative connotations. "Don't preach at me," we hear. "Sermon" is shorthand for "long, boring talk." Yet, here in church, week after week, a pastor preaches. Why? Because God delivers grace through spoken words, the Good News of what God has done for us in and through Jesus. In the Old Testament Reading, God touches a hot coal to Isaiah's lips to commission him to speak the Word. In the Holy Gospel, Jesus calls Peter, who will one day preach to thousands. From the beginning, this Word has been powerful. The Lord created through words. Now, through words, Christ continues to recreate the world. Today we give thanks that God is not silent, but continues to speak to us by His Word. And today, we hear Him call us to speak His Word as well. Like so many others before us, He calls us to become fishers of men and "let down our nets for a catch."

¹In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ²Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" ⁴And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: "Woe is me! Epistle "With my spirit, but with my mind also" 1 Corinthians 14:12b-20 ¹²Strive to excel in building up the church. ¹³Therefore, one who speaks in a tongue should pray for the power to interpret. ¹⁴For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays but my mind is unfruitful. ¹⁵What am I to do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will pray with my mind also; I will sing praise with my spirit, but I will sing with my mind also. ¹⁶Otherwise, if you give thanks with your spirit, how can anyone in the position of an outsider say "Amen" to your thanksgiving when he does not know what you are saying? ¹⁷For you may be giving thanks well enough, but the other person is not being built up. ¹⁸I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you. ¹⁹Nevertheless, in church I would rather speak five words with my mind in order to instruct others, than ten thousand words in a tongue. ²⁰Brothers, do not be children in your thinking. Be infants in evil, but in your thinking be mature.
