

Epistle "But in <u>fact</u> Christ has been raised..." 1 Corinthians 15:19-26 ¹⁹ If in this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. ²⁰ But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. ²⁴ Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. ²⁵ For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

¹ On the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. ²And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. ⁵And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ¹that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise." ⁶And they remembered his words, ⁴and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹oNow it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles, ¹¹but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. ¹²But Peter rose and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; and he went home marveling at what had happened.

Come with faith in His promises to you and His presence in this holy meal.

As you approach the Lord's table, please move to the cross on the center rail.

Gluten-free wafers are available on the two stands at the front of the church. Worshippers with a gluten allergy may pick up a sealed packet on their way to the communion rail.

Confession & Absolution (Please stand)

- L: The transformation of our lives begins by confessing that Jesus Christ is Lord over sin, death, and evil. Trusting in God's desire to forgive and restore us, let us confess our need of His grace.
- C: We confess, O Lord, that we have not always remembered the new life You bestowed on us in Baptism. We are trapped in tombs of self-centeredness and have not always sought the things that are above. Set us free by the power of Your Holy Spirit. Help us take hold of the gift of new life given in Christ Jesus. Amen.
- L: Jesus carried all our sins to His death on a cross. His sacrifice is complete and full. In Jesus' name, and by His command, I declare to you that all your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father, the + Son, and the Holy Spirit. Go in peace! Christ has set you free!


Consecrated gluten-free wafers are available on the stand in the center aisle on your way to communion.


