From Our Pastor

In light of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, many people are asking many important questions:

What does it mean to be Lutheran? Is it to go to a Lutheran church? To be born a Lutheran? To read Lutheran books? To drink coffee? To own tiny Martin Luther action figures?

Or what does the Reformation—that church movement which changed the world 500 years ago—mean today? Is it a move toward Western individualism? Is it the triumph of conscience? The beginning of Modernism... or the Enlightenment? A return to the sources? The beginning of the end for Christianity?

And who was Martin Luther? Was he an angry monk? The best thing that ever happened to the church? A tormented, guilt-ridden soul that tore the church apart? Was he a grumpy old man? A rebel? A hero?

There are many ways to answer these questions, and now—more than ever—we should be prepared with answers for them. But I would propose that one answer should be first on our lips: Jesus.

Martin Luther may have been important for many reasons, but I believe he would most like to be remembered as a **follower of Jesus Christ**. The Reformation may mean many things for life today, but if the Reformers would want it to mean anything today, it would be a return to the saving message of **grace through faith in Jesus**. And while being Lutheran may mean many things, it should always start with **Jesus**.

As we celebrate this Reformation, we celebrate Jesus. We celebrate who he is (the Christ, our God, and Lord!), we celebrate what he did (He cured the sick, cast out demons, died for our sins, and rose again for our justification!), we celebrate what he has done for us (He took away our sins and the sins of the whole world. He secured the promises of God for all people!), and we celebrate the great gifts which we have through Him (Though all have sinned, all are purified and justified freely by his grace. All this is done without any work or merit on our part!)! We celebrate the way the Reformers made him the center of their preaching **and** their lives.

In The Smalcald Articles, Luther called Jesus the "first and chief article" of faith. These words ring true today:

Upon this article everything that we teach and practice depends, in opposition to the pope, the devil, and the whole world. Therefore, we must be certain and not doubt this doctrine.

(Part II, paragraph 5)

His words still ring true today. Jesus is what it means to be Lutheran. Jesus is what makes the Reformation important today. Jesus is Martin Luther's God, Savior, and Lord; he made Martin Luther important. Just as in the book of Acts, this insistence on Jesus turned the world upside-down 500 years ago... And if we are to be remembered for anything in 500 years, I pray that it is the same thing: our focus on Jesus!

Indianapolis 500

It isn't May yet. So why the reference to the 500? We have a very different and significant reason for 500!

We gather each day in praise and thanksgiving to God for the gift of His Holy Spirit as Martin Luther nailed the 95 theses on the church door 500 years ago. This is part of our heritage -- all the way to Indianapolis in 2017. We have the opportunity each day to share God's Word. We instruct the students using the Small Catechism. We memorize Luther's Morning and Evening Prayers. Many of the teachers experienced this same instruction as they attended Lutheran grade schools, high schools, and colleges. Grandparents, great-grandparents, and great-great grandparents share in the support of Lutheran Schools through their sacrificial giving so that future generations might have this opportunity. The blow of Luther's hammer still sends out resounding echoes today.

Reformation Day is celebrated on October 31. Reformation is needed still today. As our society falls further and further away from the truths of God's Word, it is more urgent now than ever before that we gather in His Name and Word to instruct and teach His children. Today we are bombarded by accepted ideas and practices that are in direct contradiction to God's Word. Social media streams saturate us with these messages. Children are especially susceptible to accepting these as true.

We need to grab our hammers and stand for the truths of God's Word as we witness to our community and beyond the grace, love, and mercy of God through the death and resurrection of His Son, Jesus. We LOVE OUT LOUD through the power of the Holy Spirit. Let us echo this message so that future generations might still have the opportunity to attend Calvary Lutheran Church and School.

God has opened the doors to families who would not have considered Christian education opportunities within their financial abilities. How are these doors being opened?

Scholarship Grant Organization Program [SGO]

Private and corporate funded mechanisms are in place providing tuition scholarships to qualified families. All students are eligible for these scholarship grants. The same household income levels are used for the Indiana vouchers and the scholarship tax credit program. Calvary Lutheran Church and School has established our own Scholarship Tax Credit fund through The Lutheran SGO of Indiana, Inc.

Why should I consider donating to the Scholarship Grant fund?

Benefit #1: Each year Calvary Lutheran Church and School provided \$30,000.00 in scholarship money to families unable to pay the entire tuition costs. Donating to the SGO fund has eliminated these budgeted scholarships.

Benefit #2: All of your donated money comes right back to Calvary Lutheran Church and School.

Benefit #3: Students granted an SGO scholarship in 2017 will have it converted to an Indiana voucher for the 2018/19 school year.

Benefit #4: 50% of your corporate or private donation is an Indiana state tax CREDIT. Your donation also qualifies as a federal tax charitable gift deduction. If your state tax liability is less than your CREDIT, that CREDIT is extended for up to 9 years.

Currently, \$42,000.00 is needed to fully fund the 25 scholarship grant applications. Please send in your donation by October 31.

URGENCY- Why October 31?

Only \$12.5 million in State Tax Credits are issued for this fiscal year. With the growing popularity of this program, tax credit limits were reached 0n December 19, 2016. Donating earlier will ensure your tax credit for 2017. Already more tax credits are being consumed on a faster pace than last year. [Indiana fiscal year: July 1-June 30] Why not connect your donation to the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation on October 31?
