1) Question: What makes a meaningful life?

^{34b} [Jesus]said to [the crowd] ... ³⁶ For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? (*Mark 8:34b, 36*)

2) Reflection: The Great Unknown Ahead

"It's a dangerous business, Frodo, going out your door. You step onto the road, and if you don't keep your feet, there's no knowing where you might be swept off to" (JRR Tolkien, Lord of the Rings)

¹ If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³ For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God (*Colossians 3:1–3*)

3) Action: <u>Happiness/Meaning</u> is always a <u>byproduct</u> of seeking something (or we might say 'someone') <u>greater</u>.

^{34b} [Jesus]said to them, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. ³⁵ For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. ³⁶ For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? (*Mark 8:34-36*)

¹² Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. ¹³ Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. *(Philippians 3:12–14)*
